Conditional sentences / If clauses, type II

LÖSUNG

Der If-Satz Typ II bedeutet: Etwas ist *unwahrscheinlich*.

If-Satz Typ 2	If- Satz Simple Past	would + Infinitv
Beispiel:	If I lived in Australia,	I would be a sheep farmer.

1. Der If-Satz Typ II: Setze die Verben im Simple Past richtig ein.

- The streets **would be** wet if it **rained**. (rain)
- If Jake and Emma **were** late, they **would send** a text message. (be)
- I **would be** very sad if I **lost** my mobile. (lose)
- The teacher **would help** me if he **had** time. (have)
- If he **fell** in the river, he **would swim**. (fall)

2. Der If-Satz Typ II: Setze die Verben im Hauptsatz richtig ein.

- If I **was/were** you, I **would accept** this offer. (accept)
- It **would be** nice if you **came** to the party on Saturday. (be)
- If the sun **shone**, everybody **would be** happy. (be)
- If the shoes **were** too big, I **would take** them back. (take)
- The teacher **would give** us a map if we **didn't have** one. (give)

3. If-Sätze Typ 2: Setze die Verben im Hauptsatz und im If-Satz richtig ein.

- If I **won** a million, I **would visit** Australia. (win/visit)
- If someone **stole** my mobile, I **would go** to the police. (steal/go)
- I **would say** „thank you“ if Jake **carried** my backpack. (say/carry)
- Emma **would buy** a new top if she **had** enough money. (buy/have)
- If Jake **left** now, he **would be** at the cinema on time. (leave/be)
