Conditional sentences / If clauses, type II

LÖSUNG

Der If-Satz Typ II bedeutet: Etwas ist *unwahrscheinlich*.

If-Satz Typ II	If- Satz Simple Past	would + Infinitiv
Beispiel:	If I lived in Australia,	I would be a sheep farmer.

1. If-Sätze Typ II: Setze die Verben im Hauptsatz und im If-Satz richtig ein.

1. If you **gave** me your mobile, I **would call** him for you. (give/call)
2. I **would look** for a new house if I **got** a new job. (look/get)
3. If I **was/were** him, I **would ask** at the Job Centre. (be/ask)
4. It **would be** nice if you **played** football on Monday (be/play).
5. If you **took** an umbrella, you **wouldn't get** wet. (take/not get)

2. If-Sätze Typ II: Setze die Verben im Hauptsatz und im If-Satz richtig ein.

1. If you **had** the key, you **would open** the locker. (have/open)
2. We **would win** the game if we **practiced** more. (win/practice)
3. If I **got** up late, I **would miss** the bus. (get/miss)
4. If we **arrived** late, we **wouldn't find** a hotel. (arrive/not find) (Kurzform)
5. We **wouldn't send** the goods if they **weren't** in good condition. (not send/not be)
